## General Information

1. This is a selling show. Pikes Peak Whittlers does NOT ask for any commission from the sales, but Colorado Sales Tax must be collected.
2. Each full table registration will include the table (approx. dimensions 3'x8'x29" high) and two chairs. You may bring your own 8' long table and chairs, but they must have soft tips on the feet to protect the floor of the show building.
3. A map of assigned table locations will be displayed at the show. There are a limited number of spaces that have access to electrical outlets, so they will be assigned on a first come basis.
4. Competition entries and judging will be on Saturday morning, according to a schedule furnished upon arrival.
5. The show area will be locked at night. Carvings may be left on your tables overnight; however, it is at your own risk.
6. If you need assistance during the show, please do not hesitate to ask the announcer or the personnel in the hospitality area.
7. We will have a breakfast on Sunday morning. Come and enjoy good food and visit with other carvers. The breakfast will conclude in time for you to be at the show before it opens at 10:00 a.m.
8. Carving demonstrations will be held during the show. Let us know if you would like to give a demonstration.
9. A whittling contest will be held on Sunday morning.
10. Please return name tags, envelopes, any unused show materials, etc. at the end of the show.

## Directions to the Show

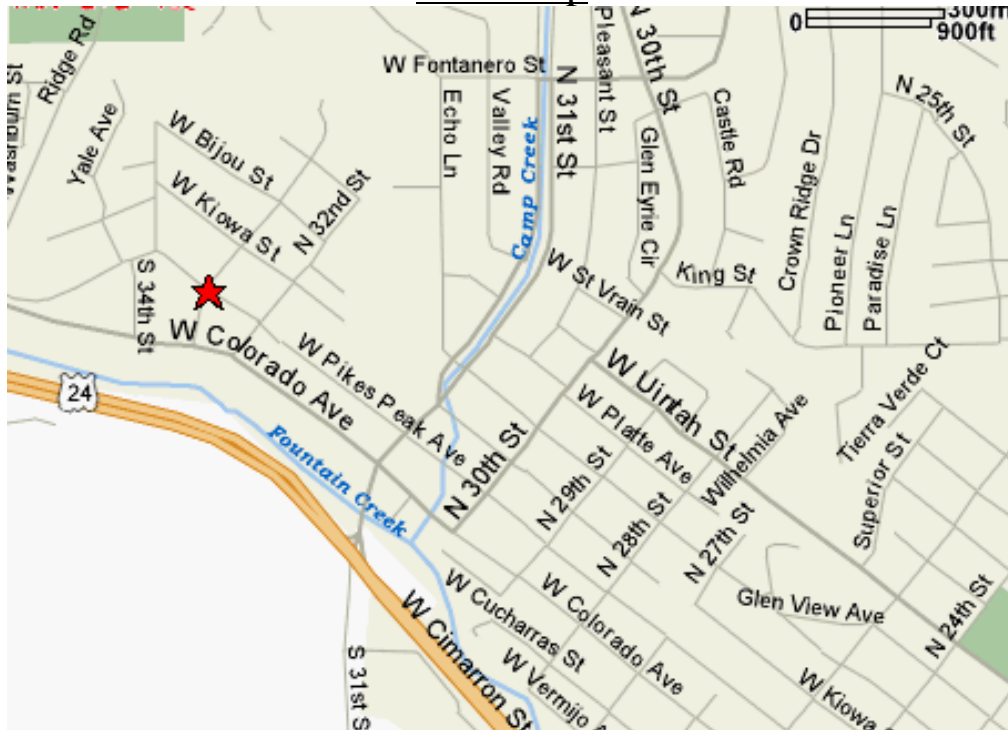
### From Interstate I-25

Get off the interstate at Exit #141, Cimarron Street (this is also Hwy 24.) At the end of the exit ramp, go WEST on Cimarron Street. Go to 31<sup>st</sup> Street and turn right (North). Go one block and turn left (West) on Colorado Avenue. Go to 32<sup>nd</sup> Street and turn right (North). Go one block and turn left on Pikes Peak Avenue to turn into the parking lot for the Shrine Club.

### From Garden of the Gods Road

Take Garden of the Gods Road west to 30<sup>th</sup> Street. Turn left (South) on 30<sup>th</sup> Street. Go to Colorado Avenue and turn right (West). On Colorado Avenue go to 32<sup>nd</sup> Street and turn right (North). Go one block and turn left on Pikes Peak Avenue to turn into the parking lot for the Shrine Club.

## SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Competition will be an OPEN COMPETITION. That is, we will award ribbons in each category for Novice carvers. Minimum point levels may apply to Intermediate and Advanced. You may compete in only one skill level.
2. Table space and electricity is limited. Reservations are taken on a “first-come-first-served” basis.
3. All tables must be manned during all show hours. Please do not dismantle exhibits before 4:00 p.m. Sunday.
4. You must be registered with at least a ½ table space and be present to be eligible to enter the competition. No more than two entrants per space. Participants of “Guest Tables” (free tables offered to promote other clubs) are not eligible to compete.
5. A limit of two entries, per category, per individual is allowed. The cost per entry is \$3.00 for all adult carvers. Under 18, the cost to enter is free.
6. Entries must be completely and solely the work of the individual, including the carving, woodburning, painting, etc. and must have been completed during the past year. All entries will be of wood, except for the Gourd division. Carvings from rough-outs are permitted only in the Rough Out category (9A). Novice and Intermediate carvers may enter pieces they completed as part of a class in the Class Piece category (9B).
7. Entries may be unfinished, painted, clear finished, burned, or any combination thereof.
8. Cast metal or plastic bills are not permitted. Metal cast legs are permitted only in the NOVICE category.
9. Glass eyes and metal/epoxy handmade legs are permitted, and metal/epoxy handmade deer or elk antlers are permitted.
10. If there are fewer than two carvings in a category, the carving may be moved to a related category, or to the open category, at the discretion of the judges.
11. The judges’ determinations are made to the Pikes Peak Whittlers standards and will not be subject to review.
12. Disputes regarding which category an entry will be placed in will be the responsibility of the entry judges, in accordance with entry standards. Judges may change an entry to a category that they deem more appropriate.
13. Regarding the carvings on the Awards Table: **DON’T TOUCH** the carvings on the awards table even if they belong to you. Items can be sold but they can’t be touched or removed from the awards table until 4:00 p.m. on Sunday.

14. Ribbons won at any other show/competition may not be displayed at this show – only ribbons won at this show.
15. All exhibitors must provide their own table covering. Table covers must cover the top and three sides of the table, reaching to the floor. No staples, pins, or tape shall be used on the tables, except tape supplied by the Pikes Peak Whittlers.
16. Entries for the competition will be called for on Saturday morning, by division, in accordance with a published schedule.
17. All competition applicants must declare their skill level classification on their competition entry registration application.
18. Please observe the NO SMOKING signs.
19. In order to maintain a certain standard for the show, the show chairman, or officers of Pikes Peak Whittlers, may request that the show chairman remove anything that is objectionable in carving, wording, or presentation. This pertains to items on display at your table as well as items on the Awards Table.

1. Originality and Creativity, unusual and exceptional interpretation
  - a. Proportions, anatomy, balance & perspective
  - b. Use of light and shadows
  - c. Use of color
2. Execution and Difficulty
  - a. Carving technique
  - b. Difficulty of carving
3. Technique and Finish
  - a. Application of finish
  - b. Consistent sanding
  - c. Does the finish enhance the grain?
  - d. Color in relation to overall work.
4. Overall Presentation
  - a. Decorative value
  - b. Worthiness of the exhibit
  - c. Continuity
  - d. Harmonious & Complimentary base design

- NOVICE** Any carver who has been carving for two years or less and who has not won any 1<sup>st</sup> place award at any woodcarving competition.
- INTERMEDIATE** Any carver who has not won at least five 1<sup>st</sup> place awards at the intermediate level or a best of show award at any woodcarving competition.
- ADVANCED** Any advanced, professional, or other expert carver with a record of successful competition; and anyone of any skill level who wishes to compete at the highest level. Includes carvers who provide professional instruction on woodcarving.

### AWARDS

1. Ribbons will be presented for First, Second, and Third place in each category. However, within the advanced and intermediate levels a minimum number of points may be required. A ribbon will be awarded for *Best of Division* in each division.
2. Special ribbons will be presented for *Best of Show*, *People's Choice*, and *Carver's Choice*. A ribbon will be awarded for *Best Table Display*.
3. A *Carver's Choice* ballot will be provided for each participant. These must be turned in by the end of the day on SATURDAY since the results will be announced at the Sunday morning breakfast.
4. Ballots for *People's Choice* will be accepted upon completion of judging through Sunday at 3:00 p.m. and the award will be presented Sunday at 4:00 p.m.
